## Mission Spot—

Baptist World Aid have received an urgent email from their Baptist partners in Papua New Guinea wondering how Baptist-run hospitals there will stay open.





"We don't know where the funding will come through to help our three hospitals, but we need financial assistance for all PPE for our workers. Our hospitals, Tinsley, Telefomin and Kompain, care for rural people and the virus is spreading so fast. Baptist Union-PNG is struggling."

They have run out of swabs, sanitisers, surgical face masks and other essential equipment that keep hospital workers safe - things we take for granted in Australia. And because these hospitals do not have enough personal protective equipment (PPE) for their frontline staff, they are facing closure right now. Almost 40,000 people in the region surrounding Tinsley Hospital will be affected. Baptist World Aids partners at Baptist Union Papua New Guinea have confirmed with suppliers that the equipment is available and can be secured and distributed within a week.
