BaptistCare Gimbawali Collections -6 & 13 August

Gimbawali Place is located at the original site of Yallambi Elderly Ladies Home on Pennant Hills Road, the birthplace of BaptistCare. The site provided care and accommodation to women post-war and over time, as the property aged and requirements changed, plans were made to repurpose the site to provide much-needed housing and accommodation for even more people. As BaptistCare's biggest community housing development, Gimbawali Place has 162 apartments providing much-needed housing for seniors and single-parent families. The development includes a children's playground, community spaces and beautiful landscaping. The lanterns at the front of the site represent a beacon, calling people home to a place of love, joy, safety and solace.

At the service on Sunday, the **Chaplain of Gimbawali, Rhonda Sabat**, will be sharing about her role and the opportunities available to support vulnerable residents.

Rhonda writes -

"I have worked as a chaplain with BaptistCare for 11 years. I worked for Home Services in aged care for almost 9 years and then moved into Community services. I was working in Hope Street with victims of domestic violence and sex workers. Recently I joined the team at Gimbawali and am very excited to work with families and seniors in this community.

The greatest goal I have in my role is to show Christ's love and make people feel valued. My prayer is that Gimbawali will be a place of safety and warmth, a refuge for those that need it. "

One way we are helping is to collect non-perishable items such as the following-

Soap, Liquid soap, Toothpaste, Shampoo, Conditioner, Dishwashing liquid, Cleaning products, Rice, Pasta, Tinned vegies, Tinned fruit, Tinned tuna etc.
